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
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Come for Lunch and Conversation About Mission

Dear Friends,

I encourage you to participate in one of the upcoming congregational forums sponsored by our Mission Study Team. We are discussing uses for the Central Presbyterian Church Mission Endowment Fund, and your input is important.

The October 13 event will happen following the 11:00 service in Fellowship Hall. Lunch will be available for no charge. When everyone is seated, a brief presentation will be made, and then we will have moderated conversations around our tables. Everyone will have an opportunity to speak about hopes, dreams, and fears, as we consider the possibilities for using this fund to expand our mission.

Essentially what we're about in this process is discernment, trying to hear God's call and follow God's direction. Frederick Buechner writes, "The place God calls you is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." What is your sense of the activities that could bring deep gladness to our congregation? What is the deep hunger in our community? I'm not sure any single one of us has the complete answers to these questions. However, as we speak and listen to one another, I believe we will gain a better sense of what God would have us do. In these forums, we are seeking to start a conversation that will necessarily continue.

The November Communion Offering

On November 3rd our monthly communion offering will be dedicated to Community of the Streets Outreach (COTS), which is the outreach arm of Lord of the Streets (LOTS). LOTS is a mission church whose members are all homeless and which holds Sunday services at Trinity Episcopal Church. Sunday worship service averages attendance of 200 to 250 and a breakfast fellowship follows the service. Volunteers prepare and serve the breakfast. St. Philip volunteers, organized by Janet Davis, serve breakfast at LOTS several times each year

COTS serves as a social service provider and advocate for the homeless and disadvantaged, committed to ministering to their spiritual, emotional, physical and social needs. COTS provides direct assistance in the form of food and clothing, crisis intervention, ID documents, counseling and referrals for other services, such as shelter and job training. COTS has carefully designed programs that address the critical needs of those less fortunate and strives to treat them with dignity and to instill hope. COTS serves thousands of homeless Houstonians each year at a facility half-way between downtown and the Medical Center.

Kids Against Hunger Fall Activities

75th Anniversary of "The Night of Broken Glass"

November 10, 2013 marks the 75th Anniversary of Kristallnacht. Ruth Brown, a Houston area Holocaust survivor and docent at Holocaust Museum Houston, will speak to the Church & Society class and tell the story of Kristallnacht and how it affected Ruth and her family when they lived in Deusseldorf, Germany.

During the two days of Kristallnacht, Hitler's Third Reich burned over a thousand synagogues; seven thousand Jewish businesses were trashed and looted; dozens of Jewish people were killed; and Jewish hospitals, cemeteries, schools and homes were looted. All this while police and fire brigades stood by and did nothing. After Kristallnacht, thirty thousand German Jewish men were sent to concentration camps.
